Budding Scientists visit Observatory for EYR

Eager pupils from Shinewater Primary School swapped the classroom for the laboratory when they recently visited the Observatory Science Centre. The visit was part of the preparation work for their programme on Eastbourne Youth Radio at 87.7FM and www.eyr.org.uk on 18th November at 12pm.

The team spent an hour exploring the different activities on offer at the centre, both indoors and out, including the water and light activities and some of the large-scale hands-on investigative activities. "Extraordinary! It's just so different to learning science at school", commented one youngster afterwards

They saw students from another primary school that were also on a visit. Some of them were taking part in a group session building bridges and some were getting very wet on the water activities. There were also older students with severe special needs who had been enjoying their visit and were browsing in the shop.

The team then went indoors to meet Jo Harris, the Education/Operations Manager for the centre. They had prepared questions to ask her about the centre's aims and activities (the recording of this discussion will be played on the show). They found out about the wide range of activities on offer, including half-term workshops for children and astronomy evenings aimed at adults. They also found out a little about the history of the buildings as part of the Royal Observatory. They told her they were very impressed with what they had seen and expressed a desire to visit again very soon!

The Science Centre are also supporting Science In-Bloom 2010 – another event for primary schools organised by Eastbourne EBP in association with Eastbourne Borough Council, and coinciding with the launch of Science and Engineering Week 2010. Invitations to take part have recently been sent to local schools.
